Scott Tinley is a Lecturer in the Exercise and Nutritional Sciences Dept. at San Diego State University and the Founder/Executive Director of the Institute for Athletes in Retirement and Transition. He holds advanced degrees in Interdisciplinary Studies and Comparative Literature/Creative Writing and is completing his Ph.D. in Cultural Studies at Claremont Graduate University. Tinley has taught sport humanities courses at the university level for 8 years and has authored five sports-related books, a collection of short fiction and published in a variety of academic journals. He won the Ironman Triathlon World Championship in Hawaii in 1982 and 1985 and the Ironman World Series three times in the early 1990s. As a 7th generation Southern California native, his first love is surfing and other ocean-related sports.
